Medical Requirements for entrance into Pre-School

- **School Physical** - All children entering pre-school must have a physical examination before entering school. A physical done after August 21st 2009 may be used.
- **Immunizations**- Your child must have the following immunizations to be in compliance with the School Code of Illinois. (Note: Pre-K students age 4 or under may not have had the last doses of some immunizations. These are usually done at the kindergarten physical examination.)
 - a. Four doses: Diphtheria, Pertussis, Tetanus (DTP)
The last dose must be given after the fourth birthday.
 - b. Three doses: Polio
The last dose must be given after the fourth birthday.
 - c. Two doses: Measles, Mumps, Rubella (MMR)
 - d. Three doses: Hepatitis B
 - e. Two doses: Varicella (Chicken Pox), or documentation by the doctor of having had the Disease.
 - f. Haemophilus Influenzae type B (Hib) vaccine – number of shots depends on type of vaccine administered.
 - g. TB Test: Highly recommended
- **Lead Screening** - All children entering school must show proof of a lead screen done between the ages of six months and six years of age. There is a place on the physical examination form where the health care provider needs to write the date and results of the screening.
- **Birth Certificate** – A certified copy of your child’s birth certificate must be on file in the office. This may be obtained from the courthouse in the county where your child was born. We are happy to make a copy for you from the original.
- **Baptism** - If you are Catholic and your child was baptized in a church other than Immaculate Conception Church, please provide a copy of the certificate to the office.

Note regarding administration of medications at school:

All medications, including “over-the-counter-meds” require a health care provider’s order to be given at school. If you wish to have an order on file at school so your child may be given any over-the-counter-meds such as Tylenol, have your health care provider fill out the attached **Medical Authorization Form** when your child has her/her physical examination. Your **Parental Authorization** is ALSO required. You must complete the back of the form. The order is good for the full academic year. In addition, you must provide the over-the-counter medication in the original container and label it with your child’s name.
