Students entering Kindergarten or 6th grade are required to have a school physical by their family physician by October 15th.



2020-21 Fair Share Contract

What's the deal with the 20/21 Fair Share contracts? That is a great question! Here is a partial answer for you. Under our current circumstances and guidelines, some of our usual fundraisers will not be able to take place. We are looking into alternative fundraising ideas that are safe and effective to raise funds. In regards to how many fair share points need to be earned, that is a topic we are discussing at this time. I think it is safe to say we will need to make some adjustments. The need to raise those funds is still there - it's just a matter of a realistic goal.

There are still some ways to earn Fair Share points that we can do at this time. Those would be the following:

- **Room Parent** Although at this time parents may not be able to enter the building we believe there may be some creative ways to have a room parent for each class
- Club's Choice (Spring) This is when our students sell different food items, which can predominantly be done online and by calling those you know to sell
- **Concession Stand** At this time we plan on having some extracurricular activities starting in January. The season will be shorter and the number of points earned will change but still an opportunity.
- ICS Auction The ICS auction is our biggest fundraiser and we plan to have the 20/21 auction in the Spring. I am not sure what it will look like, but the event needs to take place to help our school stay open.

As we find new ideas to fundraise and ways for parents to earn fair share points we will communicate those with you. These fundraisers truly help the school survive from a financial standpoint and keep tuition increases to a minimum. Tuition and fundraisers pay for student materials, staff salaries, and keep our building operating. We truly appreciate your patience and assistance.
